

Technology and Innovation

The Director's Advisory Committee on Technology and Innovation was initiated to establish the Information Communication Technology Roadmap. Prioirities: equitable access for students/staff; high speed, robust, secure infrastructure that is responsive to changing learning/business environments; automated and integrated communications/authoritative systems; ensuring timely and effective assistance and services.

Summer School/ Blended Learning

For the first time in Bluewater DSB, 266 of the 359 students who received credits through Summer School achieved them through online learning.
